The SCC Makes Giving Easy!

The State Combined Campaign (SCC) is the only authorized workplace campaign for state employees in Alabama. It is the only way State Employees can support charitable organizations through the ease of payroll deduction.

Since 1993, Alabama's State Employees have contributed **over \$21 million** to SCC charitable organizations!

- 1. Choose an agency to which you wish to give. You may search our online database at http://www.statecombinedcampaign. org/charities/. You may choose from organizations providing services in the local areas listed or organizations providing services or a state-wide or international basis.
- 2. If your favorite charity is not listed, contact the SCC office. We may be able to help.
- 3. For each charitable organization, a brief description of services provided by the agency, its phone number, 6-digit agency code and the percent of overhead is given.
- 4. You are encouraged to designate your gift. Undesignated contributions will be distributed among participating agencies in the same proportion they received designated contributions.
- 5. Complete your pledge card along with the TOTAL dollar amount you want to go to each agency and or federation.
- 6. You can give by payroll deduction (the easiest way to give!), cash, check, or credit card.
- **7. Payroll deduction:** Ask your Statewide Coordinator or Keyworker if you need to provide your entire social security number. This varies by department.
- 8. Cash or check: Just turn in along with your pledge form to your Coordinator or Keyworker.
- **9. Credit card:** You will find instructions along with a convenient way to give at http://www.statecombinedcampaign.org/credit-card-donations/. You must complete a pledge form and please be sure to include the transaction ID, so that we can easily match up your gift!
- 10. If you would like to designate your gift to a specific program or would like to make it honoring someone, please attach the Earmark/Memorial Contribution Form found at http://www.statecombinedcampaign.org/earmark-form or contact the SCC office or your Statewide Coordinator for the form.
- 11. Print your email/address on the pledge card if you want to hear from the agency(ies) to whom you designated your gift (\$25 minimum please).
- 12. Forward your pledge card either to your Statewide Coordinator or Keyworker. You can also email or mail your pledge form to the SCC office at ahopkins@unitedwaysal.org or 8 Commerce Street, Suite 1140, Montgomery, AL 36104.






